Dear Parent/Carers,

Winter Plan - From this Monday 4th December

As most of you know when the weather drops, we revert to our Winter Plan. So, from Monday we move to our Winter Plan. This essentially means that our youngsters are allowed to eat and stay in the atrium as well as the Performance Hall at break and lunch due to the cold weather, have hard-standing areas to play on and the fields are out of bounds to protect them and not have a huge amount of mud in the building and youngsters missing learning time saying they need to get changed as they are muddy.

 - Year 9 have the area by the old caretaker's house.
 - Year 10 have the area by the apple.
 - Year 11 have the area by the end of humanities.
- 4. To ensure they are still able to play football each year group will have access to our All-Weather Pitch:
 - Monday Year 11
 - Tuesday Year 7
 - Wednesday Year 10
 - Thursday Year 8
 - Friday Year 9

This may very well stay in place until Easter but will monitor the weather and could bring forward.

Year 11 PPE feedback week

In class Year 11 teachers will be feeding back results, areas which were very positive and clear ways forward to do even better next time. There is no point completing an assessment if there is no time going back through it to see where improvements can be made.

A great deal of work has gone into the preparation of these feedback sessions, and I know Year 11 have responded very positively.

Mr Riste – Safeguarding

The focus of the assembly this week was knife crime, which is an acknowledgement of the high number of incidents reported across the country this year so far (any is too many for a young life to be affected). Thankfully, this is not an issue amongst our pupils, who possess intelligence, awareness and morality in abundance, however it is also an inevitable consequence of social media that incidents involving weapons are increasing shared on social media.

As a result, we want our young people to understand the dangers, consequences and vulnerabilities involved for those who carry weapons with the aim of equipping our pupils with the knowledge to avoid and navigate any risks they may face. It was also shared that where pupils are concerned about something they read or see on the news, the school, parents and carers are there to speak to and



support. In surveys completed across Essex the biggest deterrent to carrying a weapon as identified by young people was - their parents.
