Book recommendations

For KS3, I would like to recommend: The Super-Miraculous Journey of Freddie Yates by Jenny Pearson. I absolutely loved this – it was a laugh out loud book, which tells the story of three boys who go on a huge adventure – perfect for an engaging read for years 7 and 8.

For KS4, I would like to recommend: Fairest of All by Serena Valentino. This is the first in a series of books by the author, all linked to different Disney films. These books tell the story from the 'villain's' perspective – this one is linked to the stepmother from Snow White and is an excellent book!

Why should we encourage our children to read?

Reading improves our intelligence! When children are young and we read to them, it improves their vocabulary. Therefore, the more our pupils read, the wider their vocabulary becomes, which in turn improves

their writing and their communication skills!
