

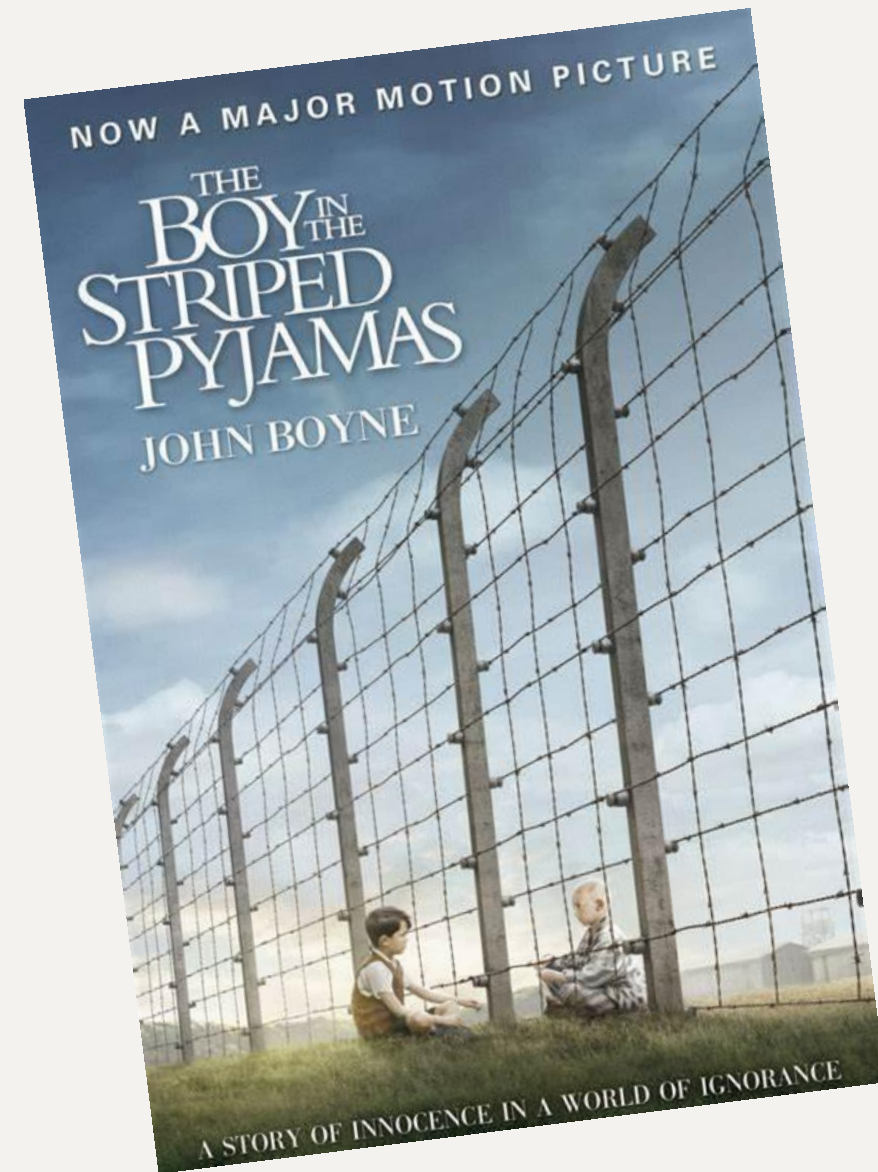
Mrs. Handford's Reading Recommendations – For KS3

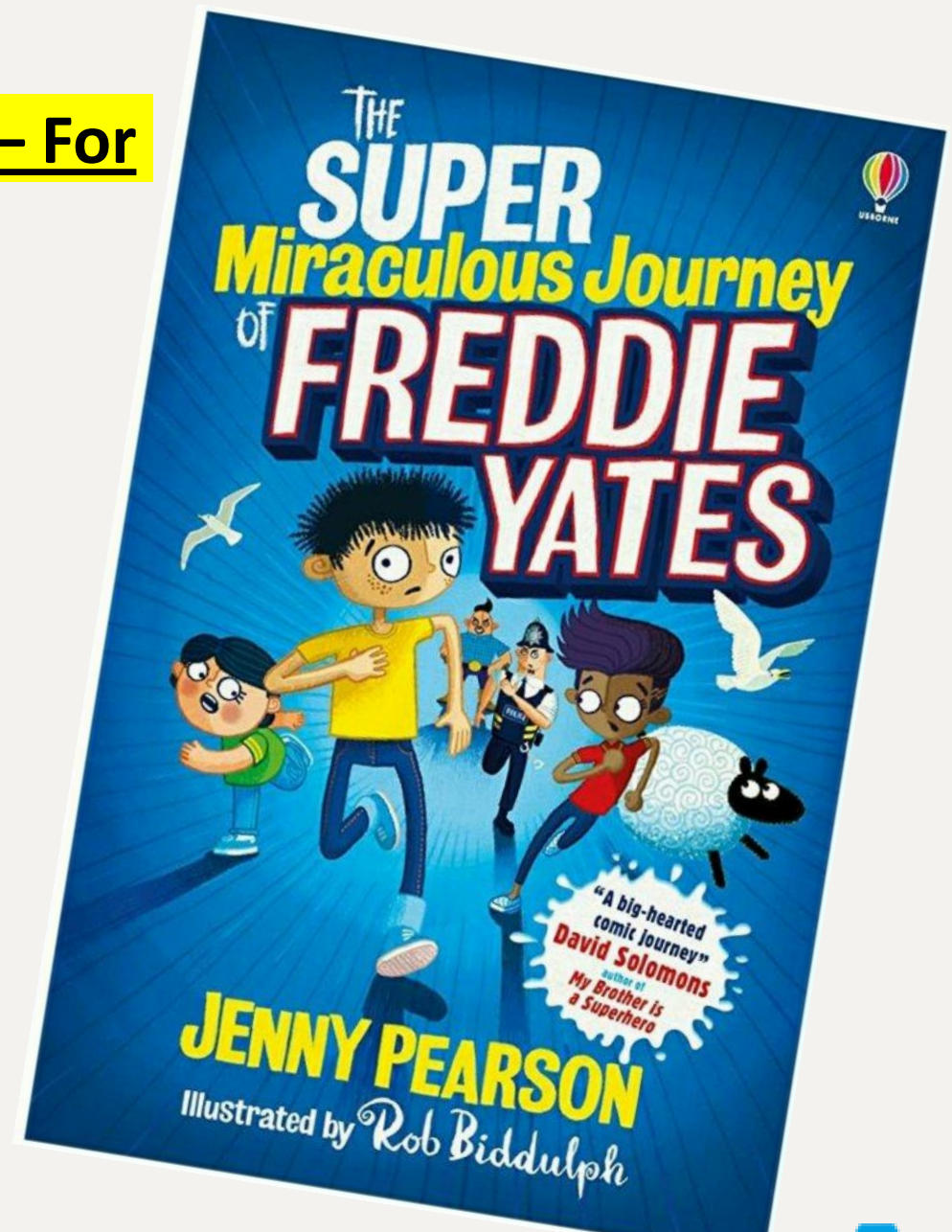

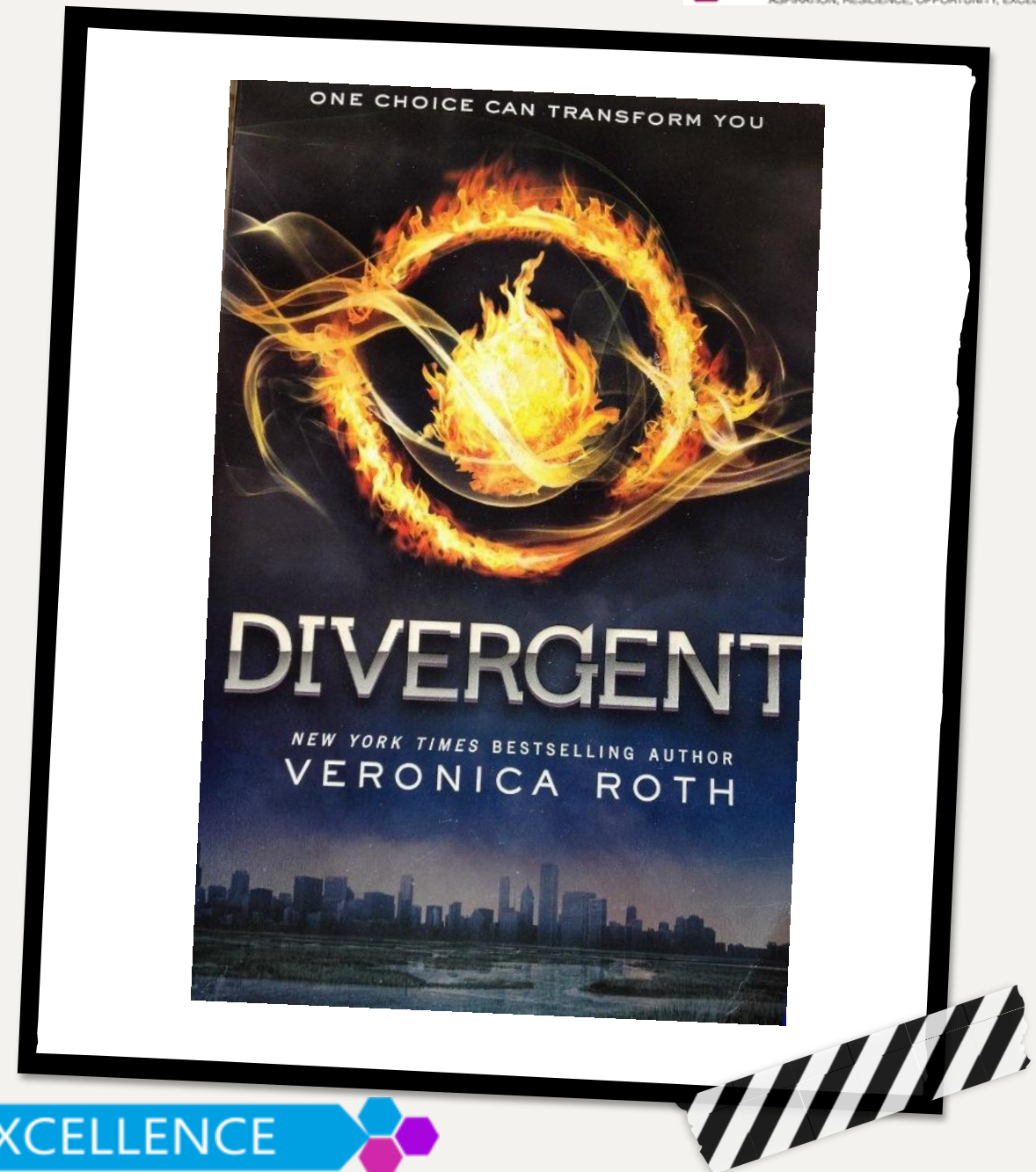
Recommendations – For KS4
