

Year 6 pupils shall be contained within the AWP boundary fencing throughout break and lunchtime Any year 6 pupils requiring the lavatory during lesson, break and lunchtime will be escorted by a Prefect who will ensure Year 6 Pupils thoroughly wash and dry their hands Primary school Pupils are not required to wear a face mask in school but can do so if they so wish Pupils and Staff are encouraged to continue to wear a facemask in corridors and communal areas.
