

Voluntary Community Governor Vacancies

As a school we are focused on ensuring academic excellence for all our youngsters, allowing them the opportunity to thrive at further and higher education. To become a Governor at Woodlands School, the most important thing is having a keen interest in the school and community that we serve as well as being prepared to play an active part in the Governing Board's work. Each term there is one Governing Board meetings which is usually held face to face, plus we have Local Governing Body meetings that meet each term virtually. We also encourage our Governors to visit the school each term to fully understand the various aspects of school life. This is an unpaid, voluntary role.

For us effective governance is based on six key features:

- Strategic leadership that sets and champions vision, ethos, and strategy.
- Accountability that drives up educational standards and financial performance.
- People with the right skills, experience, qualities, and capacity.
- Structures that reinforce clearly defined roles and responsibilities.
- Compliance with statutory and contractual requirements.
- Evaluation to monitor and improve the quality and impact of governance

Qualifications and Skills:

- A genuine interest in education and a commitment to promoting the best possible outcomes for all youngsters.
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills, with the ability to work collaboratively as part of a diverse team.
- Strong analytical and critical thinking abilities, enabling you to assess information, make informed decisions, and contribute to strategic planning.
- The ability to dedicate time and energy to the role, attending meetings and training sessions, and actively engaging in governor responsibilities.
- Prior experience in education, governance, or community involvement is desirable but not essential.

Woodlands School is committed to safeguarding the welfare of young people and expects all staff and volunteers to share this commitment. This appointment will be subject to an enhanced disclosure check from the Disclosure and Barring Service and a Right to Work in the UK check.

Training:

Training and support will be available to help you develop into the role. This will include in-house mentoring and support as well as training provided by external providers. The term of office is four years. You will be expected to attend meetings, be a member of governing body committees, maintain confidentiality, commit to training and visit the school.
