Last week, 30 members of the Codebreaking Club from Years 8, 9 and 10 visited Bletchley Park, the historic home of British codebreaking. Pupils explored the National Radio Centre, where some even transmitted their voices into space via satellite and learned how Morse code was used to communicate across radio signals. A highlight of the day was the AI exhibition, where students tested their detective skills by identifying Algenerated photos and videos and even tried cloning their own voices. The trip concluded with a Codes and Cyphers workshop, where pupils discovered different encryption techniques and had the rare opportunity to handle a genuine Enigma machine – the very one featured in *The* Imitation Game. The visit was a huge success, sparking so much enthusiasm that several pupils are already asking when they can go again.
