As I have written before there is a recruitment crisis in teaching across the country at present. You will no doubt have heard the news this week that the government has once again missed its target for recruitment of secondary school trainee teachers by 50%, even worse than last year, and that many P.E teachers are having to retrain as maths teachers given that the government only reached 63% of its target for new maths trainee teachers.















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The sad fact as that good people are leaving our profession or not wanting to enter it in the first place. The job has become much harder and the hours worked are longer, add to that the fact that 65% of graduates are now able to work entirely or partly at home in other industries, teaching is less attractive.

We do have vacancies and much of my time is spent tracking down the best available to ensure we have great people in front of our youngsters. So I would ask this, the next time your youngster comes home and moans that the lesson was not exciting, or they were asked to complete a challenging piece of work, or asked for quiet so all can get on and learn and we can teach, our core business, please do take time to remind them that all staff at Woodlands have chosen a profession that has never been tougher, is a lifelong commitment, a vocation and not just a job, and that all have chosen to work at Woodlands for them.

Now I know the overwhelming majority of our young people could not be prouder to come to our school, but we can all have bad days. We are all stronger together and we must keep on the pat we have chosen. After all, we are the second most popular school in Essex!
