Dear Parent/Carers,

As part of our ongoing process of reaching out to external experts to see how we can improve our school even further across all areas we had Tom Bennett OBE spend the day with us on Wednesday. This follows on from the P.E review we had the week before where we are looking to increase the breadth of our curriculum as well as inclusivity. This was led by Damien Lee who is Regional Director of Education for the Academies Enterprise Trust, one of the largest multi-academy trusts in the country. He was also a P.E lead when he taught so brings a wealth of experience across many areas.

Tom Bennett has worked with schools, trusts, education departments, universities, and charities, individuals across the UK and throughout the world. The Department for Education, The National Union of Teachers, Association of School and College Leaders, National Association of Head Teachers, Wellington College, the BBC, Teach First, 10 Downing Street, Harris Academies, Ark Academies, the Inspiration Trust, Uncommon Schools (New York), International English Schools (Sweden), the Times Educational Supplement, and many more.

Both brought a fresh set of eyes to what we are trying to achieve here and gave our staff some practical ways forward. We are constantly seeing how we can improve the way we are doing things and to ensure that all have the best training who work here.
