For KS4, I would like to recommend: Beauty Sleep by Kathryn Evans. I read this last half-term and really enjoyed it. It tells the story of Laura, who has been frozen while she has cancer to see if a cure can be found. When she is cured, she wakes up almost 40 years later. She faces an entirely different world; what will happen?

For parents, I would like to recommend: Hothouse Flower by Lucinda Riley. I recently read this with my book club and I absolutely loved it — a book with every element going! It is set in both the past and the present, it has romance, a little mystery, love, loss, family and everything in between! One of my best reads so far this year.
